

PYRAMID MODEL

- Framework of evidence based practice to promote healthy social and emotional development in early childhood settings
- Tiered framework provides universal supports to all children with ample opportunity to scaffold skills for those who may need more targeted support within the classroom setting
 - Allows for consistency across the classroom and school environment making students feel welcomed, supported and safe

- 3. Share your experiences and expertise with me as I partner with you in your child's journey!



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
Lunch

Help Your Child Succeed in Preschool and Kindergarten **Build the Habit of Good Attendance**

DID YOU KNOW...

Showing up on time every day is important to your child's success and learning from preschool forward.

Missing 10% of school (1 or 2 days every few weeks) can make it harder to:

- Gain early reading and math skills.
- · Build relationships.
- · Develop good attendance habits.

High quality preschool and kindergarten has many benefits!

- The routines your child develops will continue throughout school.
- Make the most of early grades by encouraging your child to attend every day.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Work with your child and his/her teacher to develop your child's strong attendance.

Talk about it - sing about it - make it an adventure!

- · Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- · Share ideas with other parents for getting to school on time.

Before the school year starts

- · Find out what day school starts and begin a countdown!
- · Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Attend orientation with your child to meet teachers and classmates and find out about health and safety procedures.

Ready, Set, GO!

- If you are concerned your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice. Ask for resources to continue learning at home if needed.
- · Ask family members or neighbors for assistance if you need help.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 medical appointments and extended trips when school is not in session.
- If your child seems anxious about preschool or kindergarten, talk to the program director, teacher, your doctor or other parents for advice.

Review for the First Day

Welcome to Preschool!

We are so excited to welcome you to Crawford-Rodriguez Elementary School. Here are a few things to know for the first few days of school.

Backpack Tags

Please connect the apple backpack tag passed out during orientation to your child's backpack. This will help staffers in the building know your child's name and their teacher.

ID Badges

ID badges must be worn every day.

Lunch

Please send in lunch if your child is not going to purchase it at school. If your child is ordering lunch, please let us know.

Snack

We make time for a daily afternoon snack. Please send in a healthy small snack for your child.

Water Bottles

Please send in a water bottle each day. (This should be separate from your child's lunch drink.)

Take Home Folders

Check your child's folder daily.
Notes that require your attention
will be placed there along with
classwork. You can also use the
folder to send notes to school.

Rest Items

Rest items will be sent home to be washed every Friday. Please send them back on Monday.

Family Photos

If you haven't already done so, please email a family photo for our Family Wall. Seeing your beautiful faces makes the day a happier one!
