Remember to consider the rhetorical situation in your analysis. - What does the writer (Abigail Adams) know about her audience (her son John Quincy Adams) and how does that play a role in the effectiveness of the use of comparison.

MESSAGE	This experience, though difficult, will be build the "character of a hero and statesman"
