Register for SCOIR

Step 1: Visit <u>www.scoir.com</u>

Step 2: Click "Log In" in the top right corner of the screen

Step 3: Click "Log in with Clever"

Step 4: Search the name of your high school

Step 5: Click "Log in with Google"

This will get you into SCOIR. You must sign off on a few things as you enter the dashboard.

Step 6 (To invite parents): Go to the "ME" button at the top of the screen—-Click "My Profile" then the + invite a parent and add your parents email address.

Junior Year

1. During Semester 2, counselors will hold Junior Meetings to discuss scheduling AND the College Application Process

2. REGISTER FOR SCOIR

- 3. Start to schedule your college visits during OUR school spring break!
- 4. At the end of Junior Year, add and follow colleges to the "My Colleges" Tab
- 5. Begin speaking to teachers about writing letters of recommendation. Make requests in SCOIR.



The Application Timeline Senior Year

Complete FERPA RELEASE IN SCOIR

12th Grade

Fall Finalize College List in SCOIR

Submit all required supplementary materials: transcripts, letters or rec, resume,

etc. Move your colleges to "applied" in SCOIR

Winter

Maintain excellent grades & continue with your activities

Spring

Review your acceptances and financial aid awards

Finish Strong and Celebrate!

Fall college info sessions in guidance

Create Common Application Account (Opens August 1)

Fill out and submit vour college applications. "Waive rights" under FERPA question.

Complete your FAFSA

Send in any supplementary materials needed for your applications or **FAFSA**

Send in deposit and make your final commitment (MAY 1st)



Summer Summer Time

- 1. Finalize your college list and add the schools to your "My Colleges" in SCOIR
- 2. Create your Common App Account at <u>www.commonapp.org</u>.

 This opens on August 1
- 3. Continue to visit college campuses and attend open houses



Senior Year: Fall

- 1. Set up an individual meeting with your school counselor
- 2. Sign into your common app and "waive your rights" on FERPA
- Make sure you are using a professional email for all college related materials. NOT your school email
 - 4. COMPLETE YOUR FAFSA



Senior Year: Fall

- 5. Link your Common App to SCOIR
- 6. Request Transcript from your counselor once your application is complete
- 7. Graciously Follow up with the staff members that are writing letters of recommendation



Some Terminology

Regular Decision - Deadlines in Late fall/winter
Rolling Admission - No official deadline,
acceptances based on availability. Can extend into
late spring

<u>Early Action-</u> Early deadlines (early Fall) non binding. This option allows you to get a decision notification earlier

<u>Early Decision-</u> Early deadline. This is a binding admissions decision. If you get accepted you MUST attend

Instant Decision Day- On site admission in one day!


What is Financial Aid?

Money that is supplied by some source outside of the family to help pay for the cost of student's education beyond high school

Federal Programs: Grants, Work-Study, Student Loans

State Programs: NJ STARS, Tuition Aid Grant (Tag), Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF)





Local Scholarships

Application completed online from Late February to Beginning of March

Must apply to be eligible

Selected by scholarship committee or funding organization



Regional/National Scholarships

Open to all students, not just from JSD.

Varied application processes

Must apply to be eligible

Posted in Naviance, Google Classroom, and can be found on websites like <u>www.fastweb.com</u>. Also check with your employers!



Applying for Federal and State Aid

Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
