Good Omens; The Nice and Accurate Prophecies of Agnes Nutter, Witch is an amazing fantasy comedy that tricks its readers into really thinking about the complex definitions of "good" and "evil". Such a seemingly simple concept that can be boiled down to nothing, can

also be greatly expanded on. What better way to bring this to life than through charming characters and a high stakes plot?

Authors Terry Pratchett and Neil Gaiman decided to write Good Omens together after Gaiman sent the first bit of his draft "The Omen" to Pratchett and was later asked if he was willing to sell the plot to him. "I said we are going to write it together," Gaiman responded, "because I am not stupid." They would talk on the phone about the book and its characters as well as go to one another's houses in order to sit down and write or chat. Writing the book as a team ended up being very beneficial to the both of them, as they would critique or add to anything the other had written, along with asking for additions and advice. As a result, the book came out better than anticipated.

Good Omens starts off with a flashback to the beginning. Biblically speaking, the beginning of everything. Our main characters, an angel and a demon, stand in the Garden of Eden and have a chat. The two discuss God's "Great Plan" and what exactly its purpose is. The angel whom we've learned is named Aziraphale is de-

Flashforward to the 1990's, and the demon who has named himself Crowley is tasked with delivering the Antichrist -the son of Satanto his unsuspecting parents. Now despite the notable differences between them, Aziraphale and Crowley have grown to become friends over the last six thousand years. Having the privilege to call the Earth their home, neither of them are pleased to realize just how quickly the Rapture is approaching. Both of them agree that what is essentially the end of the world would be a waste of something so amazing.

The two culminate a plan to stop the Rapture, by making sure they're both in the child's life. Crowley disguises himself as a nanny who will naturally be around the child quite often. Aziraphale disguises himself as a gardener, knowing that every child is curious and he'll eventually go outside and make conversation with the strange man always picking at the flowers and talking to the slugs. Doing this he won't grow up good or bad, instead maturing as neutrally as possible, just like a human. Of course, this would be a perfect plan had Crowley not mixed the child up with another. As a result of his carelessness, the Rapture's date closes in on them as they scramble to figure out a way to find the Antichrist, prevent the Rapture, and hide the fact that they've both been working with the enemy from their respective sides, Heaven and Hell.

This book is a fantastic conversation starter, both with the enticing plot and the questions that it provokes. What exactly makes a person good or bad? How can you tell, and who are you to decide that? The point of the conversation is that people as a whole have never been good and they've never been bad. They've always just been people. The ending of the book really does paint humanity in a beautiful light, even after the obstacles that the characters had faced throughout the story. It's hopeful, light hearted, and human.



#### Rewind Review: Smallville

Look up in the sky! It's a bird. It's a plane. It's... not Superman. Not yet at least.

The series Smallville premiered on October 16, 2001 with the strict rule of "No flights." No Tights." But more on that later. Smallville ran for 10 seasons with the series wrapping up in its tenth season on May 13, 2011.

Smallville tells the story of Clark Kent growing up in his Kansas hometown as he tackles being a teenager and his budding superpowers. Throughout the series we see Clark growing into the Man of Tomorrow he is destined to become as well as his struggles as a teenager just trying to fit in.

While the series starts off with a "Freak of the Week" format, meaning a new villain each week with little to no connectivity between episodes, it does eventually evolve into a more serialized format. While a lot of these disconnected episodes are good, the show really hits its stride when the overall story arcs begin. The "villains" of these early episodes (and, to be honest, throughout most of the series) are all affected by what the show calls meteor rocks. These rocks, green glowing chunks of a meteor shower, will be familiar to Superman fans as Kryptonite. These meteor rocks give people

around Smallville some amazing and deadly abilities, and prove fatal to Clark Kent.

The show deals with these weekly villains, but the real crux of the show is the relationship between Clark and the other characters, especially Lex Luthor. In the show, Lex recently moves to Smallville and befriends the young Clark Kent. What begins as a friend/brother like relationship begins to transform into the protagonist/antagonist relationship that one would expect from Superman and his greatest foe.



Tom Welling, and Michael Rosenbaum take on the roles of Clark Kent (Welling) and Lex Luthor (Rosenbaum). And their performances always manage to make even the worst episodes better. The rest of the cast is excellent as well, with John Schnieder as Jonathan Kent, Annette O'Toole as Martha Kent, Sam Jones as Pete Ross, Kristin Kreuk as Lana Lang, Allison Mack as Chloe Sullivan, and rounding out the cast as a series regular Jon Glover as Lionel Luthor.

Throughout the series other DC heroes and plenty of villains make their appear-

ance. Villains such as Parasite, Mr, Mxyzptlk, Doomsday, Bizarro, Metallo, General Zod and many others show up to fight Clark. Most of the Justice League make an appearance as well. The series sees early versions of Aquaman, The Flash, Cyborg, Black Canary, Booster Gold and Green Arrow.

In fact, the popularity of Justin Hartley as Oliver Queen was the catalyst that set off the Arrowverse in 2012 with the CW's Arrow, starring Stephen Amell as the Emerald Archer.

Smallville came out before the boom of superhero properties took over the world. It showed the origin and evolution of Clark Kent on his journey to become the world's greatest superhero. When looking back, some of the special effects that were cutting edge for their time do not hold up, but a lot of these effects do.

If you are a fan of the Man of Tomorrow, watch the show of yesteryears and see this interpretaion of Clark Kent's journey to Superman.
